KUTZTOWN - As the Kutztown Coach, **Pete Katsafanas** sat, head in hands, on the sidelines (almost looking as if he were sleeping) pondering perhaps how his team had lost a 15-point lead and were about to lose the game because of it, his Golden Bears were about to pull off one of the greatest ever EFL comebacks.

The home tome Bears had been cruising along at one point – *Tony Romo* had thrown his third TD pass of the day, a 6-yard out pattern to *Aaron Stecker*, at the start of the 3rd quarter to put Kutztown on top 21-6. The crowd had been roaring loudly and the Los Angeles offense had looked uncoordinated under the guidance of back up QB, *Brodie Croyle*. A comeback by the Knights had appeared very unlikely.

Perhaps due to complacency, or maybe cockiness, Romo followed up his great start with a careless mistake that got the Knights back in the game. Back-peddling to set up a screen pass, Romo faced pressure from a charging *Tamba Hali*. As he started to fall backwards he flung the ball wildly toward his line and into the arms of LA's *Charles Woodson*, who ran it back 27 yards untouched for a TD. The Knights added a chip shot field goal by Kris Brown soon after to close the gap to 21-16 for Kutztown, setting the table for an eventful final 3 minutes.

The Golden Bears missed a chance to ice the game when *Nate Kaeding* missed a 49-yard field goal attempt with a strong wind at his back. The Knights offense, sporadic for most of the day, pounced on the chance. Starting at their 39 yard line, with little more than one minute left, *Kevin Jones* burst off left tackle for a 32-yard run. Then *Brodie Croyle*, showing patience and poise, completed 4 of 5 passes in bringing his team the rest of the way, scoring on a 5-yard TD pass to *Steve Smith*. With 44 seconds left in the game, the Knights were doing their Happy Dance, in front for the first time that day, 23-21.

The Bears got the ball back at their own 24 yard line with a mere 30 seconds left on the clock. Looking to keep the pressure on Romo, LA sent only 5 defensive backs onto the field, and sent *Shawne Merriman* on the blitz. *Plaxico Burress* got free and made a tiptoe catch deep down the sideline for a 34-yard gain. Romo tried to find Burress again deep down the center of the field but the ball sailed incomplete. With 3 second left and the Knights 'D' frothing at the mouth, Romo took a deep drop and flung it high and long and into the arms of a leaping *Brandon Stokley*, who out-jumped track star *Nnamdi Asomugha* for the ball. It was Romo's 4th TD pass of the game and an unbelievable one at that, giving Kutztown their 4th win of the season.

PETERSON BREAKS OUT IN PAT'S WIN

GAME POINTS: Iowa City's secondary thought they had Peyton Manning's number with two interceptions in the Pat's first possessions, the second returned by Antrel Rolle for the game's first TD. However, Charleswood's leader recovered like a pro, throwing 2 TD passes on the Pat's next two possessions to stake the Patriots to a 14-13 half time lead. In a fair turnabout, Jeff Garcia was intercepted on the opening drive of the second half but the Pats failed to get into the end zone on 4th and goal from the 1 yard line. The Pats defense held off the Cub's offense in the second half while their offense chipped away with 3 Stephen Gostkowski field goals to extend their lead and stay undefeated.

KEY PERFORMANCES: Adrian Peterson rushed for 198 yards on 28 carries, setting up opportunities but failing to find the end zone. **Kyle Vanden Bosch** had 12 tackles and 1 sack. **Ronnie Brown** carried the ball 15 times for 139 yards but also did not score.

GLADS SHUTOUT STARS TO WIN 4TH STRAIGHT

GAME POINTS: A gritty goal line stand by the Gladiators turned the tables on a Markham drive in the first quarter and the North Stars were never the same again. Jamal Lewis was stopped just short of the goal line on 4th down and one, then the Glads went on a long 77-yard march, eating up almost 9 minutes of the clock, for a 39-yard Josh Brown field goal. Carson Palmer would look dominant to start the second half, throwing a 6-yard TD pass to Braylon Edwards after going 6 of 7 for 74 yards on the 80-yard drive. Markham's last red zone opportunity ended in disaster as Mike McKenzie returned a Matt Hasselbeck interception 99 yards for game's critical blow.

KEY PERFORMANCES: Carson Palmer was efficient; completing 20 of 27 passes for 215 yards and 1 TD, while **Matt Hasselbeck** was the opposite; completing only 12 passes out of 25 attempts for 95 yards and 3 interceptions.

HAWKS SWOOP DOWN ON OUTLAWS

GAME POINTS: Maurice Jones-Drew gained 48 yards on 8 carries to power a key 68 yard Ringgold touchdown drive that put the Crimson Hawks in control. After a steady diet of the Ringgold running back, the Outlaws guessed pass and went after Ben Roethlisberger with a nasty blitz, but Big Ben dodged rookie Keith Rivers and found Chris Chambers open behind the line for an 8-yard TD pass to put the Hawks in the lead, 13-3 to close off the first half. The Outlaw's offence was derailed due to consistent penetration of Ringgold's defenders into the Winnemucca backfield. David Garrard was sacked 4 times and 8 plays from scrimmage went for negative yardage.

KEY PERFORMANCES: Maurice Jones-Drew was an all-purpose performer, gaining 85 yards on the ground, 21 through the air, and 58 yards on 2 punt returns. **Ben Roethlisberger** completed 14 of 22 passes for 155 yards, 2 TDs and 1 INT. **Julius Jones** typified the overall performance of the Winnemucca offence, gaining a paltry 39 yards on 14 carries.

COWTOWN RAINS ON BUCS

GAME POINTS: Chad Pennington caught the Bucs defense crowding the line and connected with Kevin Walter on the fly for a 22-yard TD pass that opened the scoring for the Corn Kings. Cowtown dominated the first half but was ahead only 14-0 heading into the locker room after two turnovers inside the Anchorage 10 yard line prevented an early blowout. The balance did not change much in the second half – the best scoring opportunity for Anchorage ending on the Cowtown 33 yard line after a 4th down incompletion. The disoriented Bucs offense had poor field position all day and failed to enter the Cowtown red zone. KEY PERFORMANCES: It was a miserable day in the rain for Drew Brees. The Anchorage pivot threw 3 picks, two to corner, Walt Harris, and completed only 41% of his passes for a game day QB rating of 26.9. Marion Barber rushed for 103 yards and a TD on 18 carries and Laurence Maroney added another 86 yards on 13 carries to lead a 210-yard Cowtown rushing attack.

The rules are for both practical and stylistic reasons: a solid colour jersey and a white jersey to differentiate the teams easily on the field; and no dresses, to keep the weirdoes and the Scots away! Restricting endorsements to league-sanctioned decals also helps reduce the visual clutter. But the recent decree from the EFL Head Office mandating so-called "special," or third, jerseys reeks of the kind of rule a whimsical dictatorship might make. I love it! Since the idea of throw-back uniforms, two years into a league's existence, is silly on its face, the EFL has directed each team to create a "special" uniform, like a ceremonial uniform, for use by home teams on certain special days as decreed by the EFL. Cowtown, home of the grumpy old men of the EFL Establishment, unveiled its special uniform at a Press Conference yesterday – a nauseatingly bright solid yellow/gold jersey with green numbers. All teams have been directed to have a third jersey designed, approved, and *marketed* no later than Week Ten. Notice how I italicized "marketed?" That is the key, of course! The league gets a cut from the sale of all official EFL merchandise. A third jersey will expand the league's revenue once the jersey has been worn at least once in a game. Obsessive fans will not be able to resist buying a third jersey to pay homage to a favourite player. Sources at the league tell me that the EFL has tentatively designated the week of Christmas as the week when all home teams will be required to wear their third jersey. I can't wait to see this!

NEW YORK GRIPES

The **Mohave Hellfire** ran up the score on the helpless **Thundersnow** after **Colorado** accidentally scored 17 points. Although the outcome of the game was never in doubt, 17 points by the hapless Thundersnow was nothing less than a sharp blow to the honour of the Hellfire. While teams like **Markham** and **Anchorage** were able to shutout Colorado in earlier games, Mohave, one of the league's top performing teams, actually surrendered a touchdown to the Colorado offense after an 80 yard drive. In a desperate attempt to save face, Mohave ran actual running plays while up 33-17 with less than one minute remaining in the game against a red-faced and exhausted Colorado 'D.' The resulting TD pushed the Mohave point total to 40; an acceptable amount of offence against the league's worst team and almost enough to erase the disgrace of giving up 17 points to them.

JIMMY'S WEEK EIGHT PICKS

ANCHORAGE @ CHARLESWOOD (LINE - PATRIOTS BY 15)

The Buccaneers have turned the ball over 21 times, more than any other team, and are tied for last in the league in turnover differential at -8. The Patriots have turned the ball over only 8 times and are tied for the league lead in turnover differential at +13. On top of those telling stats, Charleswood has a record of 7-0 and Anchorage has a record of 2-5. The Bucs have to be the league's most disappointing team and the Pats one of the more dominant. So what more needs to be asked, other than, "is it possible for Anchorage to win, on the road, against the undefeated Patriots?" They can win if they run the ball more than 25 times, pass less than 40 times, turn the ball over 0 times, and.....get really, really lucky! Is it likely to all come together? No.

PICK: CHARLESWOOD

LOS ANGELES @ DURHAM (LINE - THUNDER LIZARDS BY 1)

This is one of those road games against a tough opponent that an aggressive team like the Knights could steal. The Lizards have been going to the air a lot, banking on the respect that opposing defenses must show to the running tandem of Frank Gore and Clinton Portis. The Knights have a very good secondary and a strong pass rush, which could spell trouble for young Philip Rivers except that the Knights have been giving up a lot of yards through the air due to their aggressive blitz scheme, designed to create the all-important turnover. The problem is the Knights have not been creating enough turnovers to make up the difference for the yards and scores they are surrendering through the air to the better offences. The personnel match-ups when Durham has the ball favour the Knights, but the opposing game plans favour Durham. The T-Lizards have one of the better front fives in the league – they respect, but do not fear, the LA blitz. When LA has the ball, they face a daunting challenge in the Durham defense. Marcus Stroud is out, but Dewayne Robertson is almost as serviceable in the interior of the line. Adrian Wilson is back from injury and he is a spark plug at safety. LA will have to use guile and deception against a sturdy Durham 'D' and hope that their own 'D' can rattle Durham's young pivot enough to score some takeaway points.

PICK: DURHAM

CHINO @ COWTOWN (LINE - CONVICTS BY 4)

Chino has the best run defense in the EFL and Cowtown's offense is built around the run. Although the Convicts have been vulnerable to the pass, the Corn Kings have struggled mightily in the passing game; ranked 15th in the league in combined passer rating. This match-up sets up a test of strength vs. strength and weakness vs. weakness when Cowtown has the ball. When Chino has the ball, the Convicts have a complete set of offensive weapons to throw at a Corn King's defense. That defense, although never dominant, has been containing the run well but underperforming against the pass. The King's front four are stout enough, but the linebackers and the secondary have been mediocre at best. The absence of last year's strong pass rush is putting pressure on the passing 'D' and injuries have been making the situation worse. The stars are aligned for passing opportunities for Jay Culter when LT is not called to duty. The Corn Kings have the home field, but it is unlikely to make much difference unless Cowtown brings their 'A' game to Tillman Field. While I would have picked Cowtown in a heartbeat last year, this year's version is a shadow of its former self while the Convicts are still near the top of the league.

PICK: CHINO

IOWA CITY @ KUTZTOWN (LINE - GOLDEN BEARS BY 1)

The only team more magical than the Cubs is the Golden Bears. An in-your-face and critically successful passing game appears to be mostly responsible for the general mystique surrounding the unlikely 4-3 team with no running game. A bend-but-don't break defense with a flair for the key turnover appears to be responsible for the other part of their success. At home they are dominant – their only loss coming against the Florida Dragons, a team they pushed to the wall. Coming off of last week's incredible last second victory over Los Angeles, I am not ready to predict they will *not* beat the West Division leading Iowa City Cubs in an equally unpredictable fashion. However, the Cubs are a very good team with their own share of intangibles. In terms of real numbers they are 3rd in the league in pass defense and their run defense is more than adequate against the Golden Bear's occasional running game. Iowa City typically has exceptionally astute game day coaching to boost their performance. This one is tough to call, but my gut tells me that the Iowa offense will combine with Demeco Ryans and Patrick Willis to edge past the Bears.

PICK: IOWA CITY

WINNEMUCCA @ FLORIDA (LINE -DRAGONS BY 16)

The 16-point line may not be enough to induce bettors to pick the Outlaws. It's certainly not enough for me. Give me 24 points and I might....I repeat, *might*....think about it. The child in me clings tenaciously to the belief that any EFL team can beat any other EFL on any given day, but that child no longer believes in Santa Claus. It would take Santa, twelve rabid reindeer, a sleigh equipped with two mounted heat-seeking missiles, a platoon of Elf Marines, and a well-aimed cluster bomb to blow a big enough hole in the Dragon's defense to allow David Garrard and Co. into the end zone. As for the other side....I am just glad I am not a Winnemucca defensive coach.

PICK: FLORIDA

COLORADO @ GWINNETT (LINE - GLADIATORS BY 14)

The Gladiators have what amounts to a free pass to stay in the Can-Am Conference Wild Card race as they host the Colorado Thundersnow. Questions turn from who will win, to who will play well. Personally, I think the Gladiators are going to take out a lot of early-season anger on Colorado and win by 30 or more points. How can the Thundersnow prevent this? They can start by scoring some points. Then they can blitz like hell to put pressure on Carson Palmer. Blitz, blitz, blitz, is the answer. With Nathan Vasher still shaken and out for the game, there is nobody in the secondary capable of covering the tandem of Reggie Wayne and Braylon Edwards, so why bother? Stop the pass at its source – the quarterback. On the other side, the goal of the Colorado offense is to move the ball any way they can. Without a running game it will not matter which QB, John Beck or Matt Ryan, takes the field. So the Colorado offense has to develop a ground game or remain impotent.

PICK: GWINNETT

MARKHAM @ RINGGOLD (LINE - CRIMSON HAWKS BY 1)

The North Stars need this game to keep pace with the Pickering Spartans in the East Division of the Pacific-Atlantic Conference. The Crimson Hawks are still dangerous after trading two of their top defenders, but this game is all about attitude more than talent. Markham is still in the Division race and has the attitude while the Hawks are sitting on the sidelines of theirs and are getting depressed. The Stars have been performing better than Ringgold defensively, while the Hawks have been marginally better offensively, but prone to turnovers. Markham is missing corner, Dunta Robinson, opening up room in the passing game for Dwayne Bowe and Chris Chambers, but a suspect Hawk's offensive line makes everything more difficult for the Ringgold offence even if it looks easy at first. Markham could actually win with a little luck, but they will need to bring everything to the table offensively to do it, and get a good game from linebacker, Mike Vrabel to boot. My heart, as cold as it is, says Markham, but my head, as big as it is, says Ringgold.

PICK: RINGGOLD

PICKERING @ MOHAVE (LINE - HELLFIRE BY 9)

The Pickering tour of the top teams in the Can-Am Conference is not going as well as hoped. In the past two weeks, Charleswood and Florida have outscored the Spartans by a combined score of 79-16. It is not about to get better as Pickering travels to the blistering hot Mohave dessert in Week Eight to face the red hot Hellfire. Donovan McNabb is, as always, the wild card, who can lift his team to improbable heights or sink them all by himself, depending on the day. I guess we'll have to wait and see which McNabb shows up next week. He will have to be really good to keep pace with the EFL's top offense.
