










In-between, the Cadillac scratched out a pair of FGs then finally found the end zone with 0:17 left. With a chance to tie, Stafford misfired on a short hitch to miss the 2-point convert.

CJ Anderson finished off a 76-yard drive with a 22-yard TD with 0:37 left in the 2nd to give Sebastian a 14-10 lead at half time. Cowtown pulled within 1 point on a 22-yard FG, but the Swordfish replied with another long drive ending on a 9-yard TD run by Dixon. The hammer came down in the 4th, when Clowney sacked Flacco for a safety then Kearse took a short slant 41 yards for a TD.

A 61-yard long slant to TY Hilton for a TD in the 2nd gave the Lizards a temporary 11-point cushion, but a 3rd & 22 TD strike of 24 yds from Rodgers to Garcon 0:12 before half time brought them within one score, 21-16. Tyrod Taylor scored the game's first and only TD on the opening drive of the game, scrambling 3 yards when his 1st option was covered. The Stars opted to ground it out the rest of the way while the Glads struggled to establish a passing game. Both strategies yielded the occasional FG try but no TDs. Josh Brown won the kicking battle 3-to-1 over Cairo Santos in a slow-moving game.

Will Compton picked off Rivers to set up a DeMarco Murray 7-yard TD run to make it 10-3, Toronto. But a 4th & 10 conversion by the Spartans to the Toronto 19 was rewarded with a Devonta Freeman TD run to tie it at 10. Toronto fell behind by 2 TDs in the 3rd but clawed back to within 3 in the 4th on a 44-yard TD pass to Tyreek Hill. But Lippett's FR TD with 1:45 left sealed it for the Spartans.

A 48-yard Brady-to-Benjamin bomb set up a Zach Ertz TD catch to give York a 10-0 lead. But with 2:34 left in the 1st half the Mustangs tied it up with a long TD drive and a DJ Swearinger INT to set up a late FG. Aurora drove 84 yards for a Davante Adams 18-yard TD to start the 3rd, but Brady tied it with a 64-yard TD pass to Williams. In the end, a 28-yard Wil Lutz FG with 0:12 left won it.




Owners are snapping up Chino's **Dak Prescott** (25FP). The young starter continues to impress with his 2nd 20+ point performance.

TO BE A PATSY

With the mainstream sports media distracted by the Trump-driven international incident over the apparently accidental non-observance of the Belgian National Anthem by *Alex Smith* and other members of the Brooklin Hawks in Bruxelles last week, coverage was initially lacking of a potentially more controversial pre-game ceremony at Stone Pony Shore. The New Jersey Wrecking Balls management announced before their Week One home opener against Budapest that they would be replacing the 'Star-Spangled Banner' with Bruce Springsteen's 'Wrecking Ball' to open all home games in 2017. Additionally, there would be no opening day ceremonial rituals, such as fighter jets flying in formation and other "cold war-esque" military themes;" and no corporate logos or sponsorship at Stone Pony.

In keeping with the general theme of rebellion, English musician and left-wing activist **Billy Bragg** opened for the Wrecking Balls with a two-hour-plus free concert in which he punctuated the air between numbers with mini-speeches dealing hazily with the concept of "solidarity" amongst owners, management, players and stadium workers – the implication being that solidarity would be needed when they eventually came under attack for their anti-corporate, anti-military, anti-anthem stance.

It was a few days late in coming, but eventually reactionary forces became aware of the Wrecking Balls using their EFL platform to push an anti-establishment agenda and those forces sounded the alarm at the White House.

'Born in the USA @springsteen is a Traitor! Should go to NK to die! MAGA – get rid of traitors!' tweeted the President on Wednesday.

Bruce Springsteen, who apparently was not involved directly in the decision to ban the national anthem at Wrecking Ball games, issued a brief statement in the spirit of "solidarity" with team management: "I was born in a USA that supported the First Amendment. Petitioning for positive change is not a crime. It is a sign of patriotism."

Somebody probably whispered in the President's ear that taking on a music icon like Bruce Springsteen would not win

over any new votes and would likely anger much of his base. He did not escalate the Titter War in response to Springsteen's statement. But **Billy Bragg**, an Englishman and an avowed left-winger, was fair game:

'Who is @billybragg? He is a terrible singer from England, who we saved from Nazi Germany. Now attacks America! Shame! MAGA!' tweeted Trump on Friday.

The EFL tried to stay out of it as much as possible, as they had done when *Colin Kaepernick* failed to stand for the National Anthem at a Cubs game last year. The league issued a short statement in which it acknowledged, in a very general way, the right of owners and players to protest lawfully, and left it at that. The league has no by-law enforcing the playing of the National Anthem at games; only a broad provision that it be "rendered in a respectful manner" by the performer. The league has sponsors, however, and it appears that the Wrecking Balls corporate ban could violate some contract provisions. But the league did not address that angle publicly. The lack of league action was enough to induce another attack by the Commander-in-Tweet:

'EFL lets owners disrespect the great USA! @jcohencollectiveconcerts does not deserve a team! He promotes garbage acts and his football team is BAD! MAGA!' tweeted Trump on Saturday after the EFL released its statement.

With the President all agitated and veterans threatening to boycott Wrecking Balls games, Bragg's concert call for "unity" and "solidarity" seems to be having the opposite effect. One wonders why the Wrecking Balls organization would want to pick a fight with the military when the military has a lot more guns and a lot more Americans serving in it than cheer for a second-year expansion team. Taking shots at the military is one thing – that's been done before and done better – substituting a pop song for the National Anthem is another thing altogether and guaranteed to provoke a reaction even among many pacifists.

Look, having traveled worldwide and visited some pretty remote places, I am well aware that Americans are not exactly loved wherever we go. Even our wartime allies are not exactly enamored with us. I write-off most of that to jealousy of the fact that – love it or leave it – we have built the most powerful and richest nation on Earth. We have built that nation upon the ideals enshrined in our Constitution combined with the indomitable spirit extolled in '*The Star-Spangled Banner*.' Is it a bad thing to be proud of that? Am I nothing but a "patsy" for being patriotic? Am I a creature to be reviled because I see a difference between having pride in the symbols of one's country and condoning the injustices that inevitably occur in a free society?

Things aren't great for everybody in the USA. And they are not going to get better if we start to attack, under the guise of "solidarity" and "unity," the real unifying symbols of the Nation.

NOT CLEARED FOR TAKEOFF

You can change their home town, even their home continent, but you can't as easily change the offensive style of the North Stars. Their signature snooze fest offense was unveiled in Budapest this Sunday in a 16-3 win over Gwinnett. The pace of play of both

the home team and the visitors induced waking comas in football fans across North America. But in Budapest it was a hit.

"Reminded me more of our football than I expected," remarked one Hungarian fan, an English language major at the Central European University. "I enjoyed the kicking and how the other team tries to block it with their hands. That's new to us."

In Budapest, fans buzzed with excitement before every field goal attempt. The extra point on the game's only touchdown drew more applause than the touchdown itself. When *Tyrod Taylor* rolled out of the pocket and, seeing his receiver covered, made a sudden dash for the goal line; the fans did not react as one to the score. There was some clapping but more than a few groans of disappointment. Exit interviews conducted by EFL Network revealed the possible reason.

"I came to see a touch down," remarked Lola, a hairdresser at the Fodraszat Hair Salon in Budapest. "But I don't think I saw one. The quarterback he make a mistake it look like."

A sizeable number of fans who had never seen the game before apparently expected to see something similar to a rugby try, with the runner grounding the ball in the end zone. When Taylor jogged out of the end zone after scoring the game's first – and only – touchdown, he tossed the ball to an official. He never touched the ground with it, prompting the groans.

Needless to say, it will take time for American football to develop a knowledgeable following in Hungary. The number of American and Canadian ex-pats living and/or working in Hungary is not large compared with Bruxelles and other European cities. Given enough time, a fanbase will develop as the national soccer team wallows at no.54 in the FIFA World

Cup Rankings, one spot behind Ghana and one spot ahead of Montenegro. In the short term, however, the North Stars must find a proper place to play. The Ferenc-Liszt International Airport is a beautiful airport and, as such, not particularly suited to hosting football games. Forget the noise of the crowd; the sound of jets landing and taking off was at times unbearable. It affected both quarterbacks equally. They were often unable to audible or establish their snap counts, with the result being decidedly lacklustre showings by both Big Ben and Tyrod.

Despite the inevitable challenges, Hungary is one of the best places **Darrin Jones** could be at the moment. A Markham and Foshan grassroots fan movement dubbed "Dawg Him," aimed at hounding Jones wherever he goes, can't as yet secure enough participants, as well as the necessary permits, to hold a protest in Budapest. It appears that Hungarian authorities do not allow their population to spontaneously riot, unlike in America, where rioting has become commonplace.

AROUND THE EFL

If two weeks of play are any indication, there could be a substantial changing of the guard at the top of the EFL pyramid. Of course, two weeks is rarely a proper indication of anything, other than the usual crappy season for Mohave and the need for preseason games to be taken more seriously. A lot of quarterbacks look rusty and it is probably the result of their back-ups playing more snaps in the pre-season than they do.

QUARTERBACKS WHO CURRENTLY SUCK:

- 1. *Ben Roethlisberger* (GEO) His team is 1-1, but the win is no thanks to Big Ben. The 'Mr. Hyde' version of Georgia's Jekyl-and-Hyde leader has been on a tear through two weeks, posting the league's worst passer rating and terrorizing Glads fans with wild throws, fumbles and pocket nonchalance. He will wake up one day and resume his potential hall-of-fame stature. But will he do so in time to give the Gladiators a shot at the post-season?
- 2. **DeShaun Watson** (CHP) Let's cut him some slack since as he is a rookie. But how bad must **Blake Bortles** be in the eyes of the Patriots' coaching staff that this guy has managed to stay on the field for two full games?
- 3. *Carson Wentz* (STC) The Chargers really need Wentz to be close to his rookie form if they are to compete in the East. So far, the 'rookie' Wentz is nowhere to be seen. Instead, the sophomore version is providing a textbook case of the infamous "sophomore jinx."
- 4. *Joe Flacco* (COW) This guy once won an MVP in this league! Right now, he's looking like he couldn't win an EFL Punt, Pass & Kick competition in the 12-year old category. I don't know what the problem is, but I am sure it is not his wide receivers, his run support, or his offensive line. That leaves Joe, or his coach, as the one to blame.

TEAMS THAT ARE ALREADY PANICKING:

- Twin Cities No Triumph team has ever started 0-2. Couple that with a perfect season in 2016 and it is perfectly understandable why the fan base is already panicking. No doubt this has been a worst-case-scenario start for Guy Williams and his defending champs. But as long as the team itself is not panicking, they should be fine.
- 2. **Cowtown** Cowtown fans are delusional if they think their beloved Corn Kings are getting anywhere near the playoffs this year. But the fan base is in hysterics anyway, having pencilled in wins over Durham and Sebastian in most local preseason projections. Stop panicking, people! Cowtown is at best an 8-8 team and they can certainly still reach that mark.
- 3. **Charleswood** This is not the strongest Patriots team to be fielded in its history, but with what looks to be a wide-open competition in the Central Division and increasing league parity, the Pats have as good a shot as most. While the 0-2 start is problematic, the cause of the panic is the fact that the strength of their team, the defence, is playing like crap.

TEAMS CELEBRATING PREMATURELY:

- 1. **Bruxelles** While I like the Bombers to continue playing a "bombs away" style that will be a pain in their opponents' butts all year, I think we can all agree that if they make the post-season it will be close to a miracle. Nevertheless, the Bombers are already selling T-shirts emblazoned with the slogan 'Geloven-Croyez' ("Believe" in Dutch and French) and tendering special stadium security contracts for the post-season. If the starting 11 of the Bruxelles defence was as security conscious as the management of the team I might agree they had a shot; but they aren't.
- 2. **Chino** I like *Dak Prescott* a lot the Convicts have a future with the guy. But that future is not now, notwithstanding a nice 2-0 start that included a 38-21 whopping of the Defending EFL Champs.
- 3. **Virden** The Violators themselves are not actually celebrating their 2-0 start; it's not in their nature. But some pundits are getting carried away with voicing love of a team that everyone knows will hit in the infirmary *en masse* by Week 8.

THE NEW GUARD (teams that appear ready to take over):

- 1. **Iowa City** The Cubs drew some fire for allowing Seattle to stay in the game in their Week One home opener, but demolishing Charleswood 40-20 shows what they can do when they take an opponent seriously. Be prepared to follow the Cubs deep into the post-season this year.
- 2. **Scarborough** the Blue Eagles went toe-to-toe with the Thunder Lizards and would have won but for a great play by a veteran Durham defender. **Chris Dickinson** looks like he is fed up with failure and ready to win now.
- 3. **Brooklin** Yes, they lost to Bruxelles, but there were extenuating circumstances in that game. The Hawks are the real deal and will blow away their East Division competition on their way to a date with the Cubs in the Conference Final.

So far Ben Roethlisberger is playing as bad as I have ever seen him play and LeSean McCoy was banged up in Budapest last week. Take those two out of the equation and the Glads' offence has little to offer against a stout and high-performing Hawks D. Alex Smith is coming off a great day against a suspect defence and he can thank DeAndre Hopkins for most of it. No question the Hawks have the air force to inflict material damage on the Georgia secondary, but a paper-thin depth chart at running back, with Randall Cobb listed as back-up to Ryan Mathews, places the balance of the offence in constant jeopardy. An injury at RB would change the competitive picture, as would Big Ben playing like even a half decent QB; but I'm not betting on either. **PICK: BROOKLIN**

MOHAVE @ TORONTO (line – HELLFIRE by 6)

INJURIES: Mohave — Ezekiel Ansah (OUT), Tevin Coleman (OUT), Kevin Johnson (OUT), Jimmie Ward (OUT); **Toronto** — Shawn Williams DOUBTFUL), Austin Howard (OUT), Danny Trevathan (OUT), Aaron Williams (OUT), Eric Wood (OUT).

Both teams are 0-2, but in reaching that early milestone on the long road to Loserdom the Wolverines have looked much more alive than the Hellfire. However, Mohave remains, in the eyes of many experts, somewhat of a contender in the East while lowly Toronto remains, well....lowly. This lowliness is thanks to a defence that lasts about one quarter before collapsing and an offence that struggles to get it done while the game is still within reach which, in fairness, does not give it much time. But v.2 of the Andrew Luck offence in Mohave has looked pitiful, especially in the red zone where they have yet to score a point! How an offence performing that poorly can be expected to win a game by a touchdown is beyond me. **PICK: TORONTO**

BRUXELLES @ AURORA (line – MUSTANGS by 10)

INJURIES: Bruxelles – Muhammad Wilkerson (PROBABLE), EJ Gaines (OUT), Donte Moncrief (OUT); Aurora – Rashad Robinson (PROBABLE), Duane Brown (OUT), Bradley Sowell (OUT).

The two highest-flying offences face-off at Magna International Park in Aurora in what I expect to be a fireworks contest. Matt Ryan is likely to sling the pigskin more than 40 times; not just because he can but because he must. Harrison Smith is the only star in an unimposing secondary and Aurora has yet to declare a no.1 running back. This one-dimensional attack will score, but whether it can keep up with a much more balanced and no less deadly Bombers offence is the open question. Emmanuel Sanders will be locked up by Patrick Peterson and Travis Kelce will be well-guarded by Earl Thomas, but Leonard Fournette is a beast who will force the Mustangs to respect the run. By no means is this a 10-point spread and take the 'Over' as well. **PICK: BRUXELLES**

ERIEAU @ CHINO (line - CONVICTS by 7)

INJURIES: Erieau – Rhett Ellison (PROBABLE), Justin Houston (OUT), Eric Reid (OUT); Chino – Takkarist McKinley (QUESTIONABLE), Jatavis Brown (OUT), Seldon Brown (OUT), TJ Ward (OUT).

It is a sign that Vegas likes what it sees from Dak Prescott and the Chino offence that it has endorsed them with a 7-point spread against an Erieau defence that has surrendered the fewest points in the league. The spread could be also partly due to the fact that the Cadillac offence has scored the third fewest points in the league. Matt Stafford has not shown that he belongs back in the EFL

after being cut loose by Virden two years ago and Christine Michael has not proven Budapest wrong in trading him in the off-season. The Convicts defence, formerly known as the 'Lockdown Crew,' is reapplying for that nickname after a better-than-expected success over the first two weeks. All overt signs point to a beatdown for the Convicts, but I expect that the Erieau offence to finally find a groove this week. Perhaps not enough to win, but enough to stay close. **PICK: ERIEAU**

LOS ANGELES @ TWIN CITIES (line – Pick'Em)

INJURIES: Los Angeles – None; **Twin Cities** – Tyrone Crawford (OUT).

The Triumph offence is second last in net yards per game and dead last in yards-per-play. So how does anyone expect it to regain its moxie against one of the best defences in the league? Antonio Brown – that's why. He was held in check by Chino last week because Jay Cutler could not get the ball close to him. Carson Palmer returns this week and must be eager to wipe out memory of the Week One debacle against Erieau. If the 'Blue Shield' has a weakness, it lies in the secondary, which is merely average and reliant on pass rush pressure from the front seven. Andy Dalton's tenure with his new team has been streaky over a 1-1 start. He will need to show more consistency if the Knights hope to outscore the Triumph on their home turf. **PICK: TWIN CITIES**

SEATTLE @ CHARLESWOOD (line – PATRIOTS by 4)

INJURIES: Seattle – Kareem Hunt (QUESTIONABLE), Buster Skrine (QUESTIONABLE), Phillip Dorsett (OUT), Jelani Jenkins (OUT), Derek Newton (OUT), Ed Reynolds (OUT), Luke Willson (OUT); **Charleswood** – Lamar Miller (QUESTIONABLE), Cameron Heyward, (OUT), Demarcus Lawrence (OUT), Brandon Mebane (OUT), Harlan Miller (OUT), Desmond Trufant (OUT), Sammy Watkins (OUT).

The Pilots arrive in Charleswood just in time to stop the bleeding away of the Pats' playoff aspirations. The injury list is long for both teams, but with Phillip Dorsett out and Kareem Hunt questionable it is hard to imagine Seattle sustaining an effective offence. The Pats must make a decision about their quarterback: do they continue with the DeShaun Watson experiment or do they revert to the proven mediocrity of Blake Bortles? Either should win this game handily. **PICK: CHARLESWOOD**

SEBASTIAN @ YORK (line – SWORDFISH by 6)

INJURIES: Sebastian – Austin Johnson (OUT), Denzel Perryman (OUT), Mike Pouncey (OUT), Marshall Yanda (OUT), Shariff Floyd (IR); **York** – Zach Ertz (PROBABLE), Branden Albert (OUT), Eddie Lacy (OUT), Brandon Flowers (OUT), DeAndre Levy (OUT).

It took one big game last week from the big guns, Odell Beckham and Jameis Winston, to turn Sebastian into big road favourites. With echoes of the 2016 Fish still reverberating and the Excaliburs winless, oddsmakers feel emboldened to return to what they think they know. But I'm not ready to buy into the 2017 Swordfish yet. The Corn Kings did not play well on both sides of the ball and Winston had all day in the pocket. The loss of Marshall Yanda will be particularly felt here against a front seven that boasts Geno Atkins and Von Miller. Consider also that Tom Brady is unlikely to play as poorly as Joe Flacco despite fewer choice options at WR. The Swords desperately need a win to finish off a disappointing homestand on a high note. **PICK: YORK**

DURHAM @ BUDAPEST (line – THUNDER LIZARDS by 2)

INJURIES: Durham – Terron Armstead (OUT), Jalen Collins (OUT), Mike Davis (OUT), KJ Dillon (OUT), Elvis Dumervil (OUT), Kevin White (OUT); **Budapest** – Jaye Howard (OUT), Brian Hoyer (OUT), Kyle Long (OUT), Jordan Reed (OUT).

Already being billed as a possible Atlantic Conference Final preview, this will be a bellwether game for both teams' playoff chances. The Lizards were probably happy with their tie in Scarborough last week. Although neither team deserved to lose, psychologically the Lizards know they can match a tough team on the road. A tie against the North Stars would be disappointing. Budapest showed absolutely zero explosive qualities with Tyrod Taylor at QB last week against a shaky Glads defence. Expect the Markham ground game to be featured again in an attempt to limit Drew Brees' touches. That strategy could backfire. The Stars don't have a viable match-up to limit TY Hilton and one quick 60+ yard bomb is all it takes sometimes. **PICK: DURHAM**

PICKERING @ SCARBOROUGH (line – BLUE EAGLES by 1)

INJURIES: Pickering – None; Scarborough – Don't'a Hightower (OUT), Josh Hill (OUT);

The season is going according to plan for Pickering, even if that plan did not include sweating it out at home against Toronto; they won and that's what counts. This week the resurgent Spartans could face their first stumbling block against a Scarborough defence that appears to be able to enforce a no-fly zone over their opponents. Opposing passers have a combined 42.1 QB rating against the Eagles, and that includes Drew Brees' best effort last week in a dramatic tie. This causes worry for Philip Rivers fans, who know from experience that their hero can be, let's say, a little *erratic* with ball placement. Devonta Freeman will play a huge role

for the visitors. On the other side, the Eagles would like to get Jordan Howard rolling more to boost their striking power. The Eagles feel they can dominate on offence as well as defence. This would be a good week to start. **PICK: SCARBOROUGH**

NEW JERSEY @ COWTOWN (line – WRECKING BALLS by 3)

INJURIES: New Jersey – Josh Mauro (QUESTIONABLE), Vince Wilfork (QUESTIONABLE), James Harrison (OUT), Brian Winters (OUT); Cowtown – Marcell Dareus (OUT).

You know the situation looks bleak in Cowtown when the Wrecking Balls are expected to demolish them in their home opener. Not so fast, I say. Sure, Joe Flacco has looked brain-damaged in the pocket, but he is not the only quarterback off to a poor start. Yes, the defence looked lost last week in Sebastian, but remember that Terence Newman was out of action and the pass rush mysteriously failed. New Jersey, while looking much better in two losses, has yet to find an identity on offence and James Harrison, arguably their best defender to date, is out of action. I am confident this game will be a miserable, barely watchable slog-fest, but less confident that New Jersey will steal it on the road. **PICK: COWTOWN**

VIRDEN @ IOWA CITY (line – CUBS by 3)

The Violators are in first place and enjoying the unfamiliar vantage point. But an old nemesis, the injury bug, is coming into play with a couple of "questionables" in the secondary and three offensive linemen down. How much effect they will have is unclear. Virden pursued an unconventional (for the 21st century) game plan last week, rushing the ball over 50 times and throwing it just 11. They are likely to try something similar against a ball-hawking Cubs defence that has lost a few dozen pounds on their D-line. The Cubs, with their monster offensive line, are happy to play tit-for-tat, up to a point; they will eventually want to test the Virden secondary despite Eric Berry's sobering presence in center field. Expect an undramatic Cubs win. **PICK: IOWA CITY**

ST, CHARLES @ SOUTH CAROLINA (line - REGULATORS by 9)

INJURIES: St. Charles – Morris Claiborne (OUT); **South Carolina** – Zach Zenner (QUESTIONABLE), Ameer Abdullah (OUT), Keenan Allen (OUT), Ladarius Green (OUT).

Wooaah! A 9-point line in favour of the Regs? What gives? The Chargers defence – that's what gives. After stopping the Hawks' first drive last week, they gradually became less effective as the game went on – finally collapsing in the second half. Conversely, the Regs sustained some thrust against a respectable New Jersey defence, with Kirk Cousins getting unanticipated but helpful support from the running game. Throw in that Carson Wentz has completed less than 50% of his pass attempts so far and one has the makings of a foregone conclusion. There is just one problem with that conclusion, in my view. The most important piece of the Charger attack is back, Michael Thomas. Expect him to resurrect Carson Wentz. **PICK: ST. CHARLES**





FROM THE EFL ARCHIVES – The continent watched as the Blue Eagles rose to 2-0 with a grueling 13-10 win over rival Gwinnett. Fans were looking for cracks to appear in the team once known as the Dragons – the league's first dynasty – but no fissures were apparent in the epic defensive struggle.
