

LOS ANGELES – The Knights performed as advertised – they frustrated the Durham offence and moved the ball with fair efficiency against the Durham defense. They built a 10-point lead and commanded the pace of play, holding the advantage in time of possession over the T-Lizards by more than 6 minutes. Unfortunately, when it came down to controlling the ball, they suffered a fatal flaw – they gave it away once too often, allowing Durham to score 10 points off turnovers and eke out an upset on the road.

With the score tied at 17 and 4 minutes remaining in the game Los Angeles took possession at their own 20 yard line with *Tarvaris Jackson* at the helm. Jackson had replaced an ineffective *Jason Campbell* in the second quarter and had led the Knights' two touchdown drives: completing a 2-yard TD pass to *Steve Smith* and running in another on a scramble from one yard away. Durham's defense had been bending all day and fans at Round Table Stadium expected them to continue to bend – at least enough to allow their beloved Knights to advance the ball inside *Kris Brown's* field goal range for the winning kick. With injury-plagued *Steve Smith* on the sideline stretching out a cramped muscle in his leg, the Knights' offence took the field without their principle quick-strike weapon. But that did not diminish the optimism of the crowd – lusty cheers swelled to a roar as "Sir Tarvaris" strode onto the battlefield.

In less than a minute there was a roaring silence as *Ellis Hobbs*, with pterodactyl-like stealth and precision, swooped down on a pass intended for *Roddy White* and fell to the turf with the ball secured beneath him at the Los Angeles 25 yard line. The sputtering, spasmodic Durham offence took over and moved the ball a mere 5 yards in 3 plays from scrimmage, but it was enough to give *Mason Crosby* an attainable field goal try. He did his part by knocking it through just inside the right upright to give Durham a 20-17 lead with a little more than 2 minutes remaining.

Now trailing, the LA offence embarked on the final drive to try and salvage the game they probably should have been winning. But Jackson looked tentative and the offence looked deflated as they tried to move the ball, employing the run and short passing plays against Durham's nickel defensive set. *Steve Smith*, who has been out of games more than he has been in games this season, sat on the sideline unable to help his team when they needed him the most.

In spite of Smith's absence, the Knights managed to cross midfield with 39 seconds left. But a holding penalty to tackle *Kareem McKenzie*, his second penalty of the drive, pushed them back to their own side of the 50 yard line and forced Jackson to the air with a little more urgency. With his receiving corps blanketed, he was forced to check down to *Todd Heap* on 4th & 14 and the tight end was tackled 7 yards short of the first down by Durham's defensive captain, *Adrian Wilson* to assure the win for Durham.

POST GAME: *Jason Campbell*, who started the game for Los Angeles, got the quick hook after being intercepted by Wilson in the second quarter. Jackson took over and was successful for most of the game until the critical interception by Hobbs. *Jeff Dohrn* seemed more upbeat than expected after a tough loss, defending Jackson and supporting his offence; "We did a lot of good things today and I am happy overall with the way we executed our game plan. We couldn't overcome the turnovers. You can't give the ball away three times against Durham and expect to win." An obviously relieved, *George Kaldis*, speaking after stemming a 2-game losing slide, was less complimentary of his team in victory; "We got a gift today and we'll take it," he said. "We did not turn the ball over and I was happy to see that, but we have to get more consistency on the attack. We have to convert third down more."

SECOND HALF SURGE SAVES GLADS

GAME POINTS: Matt Cassel fumbled away the ball on his own 9 yard line to start the second half and the Violators took advantage when **Drew Brees** connected with **Devin Hester** two plays later for a 10-yard TD pass to give Virden a 14-6 lead. That set the stage for a clutch comeback by Gwinnett starting with Cassel going a perfect 5 of 5 for 45 yards and an 8-yard TD pass to **Reggie Wayne** on their next possession. Near the end of the 3rd quarter, **Leon Washington** broke a short hitch pass for 32 yards to stab deep into Virden territory, then finished the drive off with a 14-yard TD run and a 2-point conversion to put Gwinnett ahead to stay. GAME POINTS: Riding the arm of rookie **Matt Stafford**, the Crimson Hawks overcame an early 14-point deficit to soar to a 24-14 lead in the 4th quarter after **Santonio Holmes** turned a short dump-off pass into a 22-yard TD. If baseball finances do not change, teams like Pittsburgh and Kansas City will never see a Championship again.

GARLAND REAPS REWARDS OF SMART DRAFT, FREE AGENT ACQUISITIONS

The surprising Garland Gladiators are showing that a team can be made from scratch through expansion and become competitive in short order. Garland's sophomore season is turning into the early chapters of a Cinderalla story. At 4-2 after winning a wild one this week against Mohave, they sit in a tie with Gwinnett for second place in the South Division. If they continue at this pace, and the North Division remains stalled at the side of the road, they will make it into the playoffs as a Wildcard team. In the unlikely event of a Florida collapse, they could actually steal the Division. How are they doing it?

While fellow expansion classmates built for the present (Pickering), built for Pickering (Markham), or simply did not build at all (Winnemucca), Garland, as the Colorado Thundersnow, built for the future, starting with a smart expansion draft. The jewel in the Garland draft crown is quarterback, *Matt Ryan*, who is hands down the early favourite for league Offensive MVP. Other standouts from that original draft are middle linebacker, *Jerod Mayo* and running back, *Matt Forte*, each of whom has contributed to their team's early success.

This year they traded for tight end *John Carlson*, signed *Frank Gore* away from Durham, signed *Wes Welker* and drafted *Brian Cushing*, all of which are turning into good moves. The one deal that they may regret down the road is the trading of *Andre Johnson* to Ringgold for Charleswood's first round pick. That pick translated into wide receiver *Darrius Heyward-Bey*. The Maryland product is undeniably fast but slow to pick up the complicated professional playbook. He looks lost on the field. Who knows if Garland's run of good fortune and clutch play from their quarterback will continue, but for now all is good in Garland.

CRAZY FANS INSPIRE, AMUSE, REPULSE

You won't find them listed on the Program. You will rarely know who they are. They don't get paid. But for 8 days of the regular season they will garner local notoriety – sometimes even stardom – subsequently disappearing from the public view when the season is over to perform whatever duties their mundane regular jobs require. They may inspire, amuse, or repulse you, but you will never be indifferent to their antics. They are the "crazy" fans; the fanatics; the lunatics; the nut-jobs; and they come with every team.

The 'Fat Lady in Row 54' grabs most of the media attention, often for the wrong reasons, but she is only one – albeit a very large one – of dozens of deranged "Super Fans" on display in EFL stadiums on game day. This week a national television audience caught a snippet of Los Angeles' "Sir Dancealot" as he performed a hip hop routine and rode a kite shield down a flight of stairs to celebrate a touchdown pass from Tarvaris Jackson to Steve Smith. They also saw the Black & White Knights, a duo consisting of an African-American male wearing white armour and a Caucasian male wearing black armour who collect women's scarves from the crowd and duel with plastic swords during commercial breaks.

If you have EFL Sunday Ticket you may have caught a glimpse of Virden's "Hooded Hangman," who ritually executes bobble head dolls of opposing players, or Pickering's "Spartacus," who strides about proudly in nothing but a leather skirt and plumed helmet knocking fans wearing opponent's paraphernalia on their heads with a giant inflatable bat. You would not, however, have seen Kutztown's "Bear-naked Guy," the streaker who sneaks into every game in disguise and at the appointed time – usually during a prolonged commercial break or at half time – strips naked, dons his Yogi Bear mask, and runs across the field of play

carrying a banner that says something different every week. This week, according to a contact in Kutztown, the banner read, "I AM TONY ROMO'S LOVE CHILD." Crazy, yes, but at least he's not throwing around poopy underwear.

RAUCOUS RALLY IN MARKHAM RAISES "BIGGER" ISSUES

The Ontario chapter of the League of Large Ladies (LLL) spearheaded a rally on Wednesday in support of Gretta Clapper, better known as "the Fat Lady in Row 54." Large women from across Ontario and as far abroad as Manitoba, Michigan and Western New York converged on the City of Markham and gathered in the parking lot of 'The Kennel,' a popular sports bar three blocks away from 'The Dawg Pound.' They were joined by approximately 1,000 local North Stars fans. Together they marched on the stadium to demand justice for the Fat Lady.

It was less of a "march" and more of a "waddle." The throng had to pause after two blocks while some of the more ample demonstrators, who could no longer continue, were loaded by forklift onto flatbed trucks to be transported to the stadium rally point. There they chanted slogans, listened to speeches, snacked on pastries, and burned Calista Flockhart in effigy. The whalelike President of the LLL, Barbara Brandt, (who, according to her website bio weighs in at 310 lbs but actually looks much larger) demanded not only that the charges against the Fat Lady be dropped, but that she be financially compensated for her trauma and an apology issued to "Grand Women" everywhere. She vowed that the LLL would provide financial support for her court case through proceeds from the sale of butter tarts and honeyed hams donated by Friends of Fat, a newly formed local support group.

The argument being made by the LLL is that security, police and several fans at the stadium who tried to help them, discriminated against Clapper because of her size; specifically, that they "overreacted" because they were unduly intimidated by her girth and that she was acting in self-defense when *they* attacked *her*. Private videos made at the scene are making the rounds on 'YouTube' and the some of the scenes are supportive of the contention that the Fat Lady was somehow beset upon. In one clear shot you can see an orange-clad security guard approach Clapper from behind, grab her arm, and in a flash she reaches over with her other hand and places the struggling guard in her mouth. It has the appearance of an automatic response triggered unconsciously by the surprise contact and, indeed, the guard came at her from her "hot dog side" where she keeps her hay boxes.

The surprising backlash momentarily turned authorities in Markham to a more conciliatory position as they tried to placate the massive mob and avoid the Sit-in and Eating Strike being threatened by a dozen of the heftier LLL members. "We are prepared to eat until we burst if Justice is not done," said one of the protestors, as a palate of hot cross buns was dropped off behind her. It did not appear to be an idle threat as many of them had already started gorging on everything from cookies to pork rinds. The result was a postponement of Markham's Week Six game versus Chino while lawyers attempted to work out a compromise that would allow the Fat Lady to remain in her row for the game. North Stars beat writer, Lanny McDonald reported that as part of the deal, the Fat Lady agreed to be air-lifted out of her seat on Monday, which, as this goes to Press, has not yet transpired.

To her credit, the Fat Lady was comparatively mellow during most of the humdrum contest between the North Stars and the Convicts. But the holding penalty against *Tyson Clabo* at the Chino one-yard line that nullified a Markham touchdown in the fourth quarter was too much for her excitable nerves. She exploded with pent up fury, roaring so loudly that she drowned out the referee and caused several dozen fans to faint in terror. A cordon of security, led by a tactical police weapons team, converged immediately on Clapper and rendered her temporarily mute through application of a Court-sanctioned elephant tranquilizer. As I write this, internet blogs maintained by the LLL (cutely known as "Blobs") are alive with outrage at this treatment. It is going to be a long week for the Markham Police Crowd Control Unit.

HAWKS HAVE BIRD FLU

It has to be an illness....and it's contagious. Just when I was about to lay all of Ringgold's troubles at Big Ben's lap, Week Six against Charleswood happened. If you have the game taped, go back and watch this fascinating study in collapse. All the normal rules of momentum, so critical to success in regular football, suddenly fly out the window over an eight-minute span in the fourth quarter of this game.

The Hawks, trailing 14-0 early and en route to being blown out yet again, yanked *Ben Roethlisberger* in favour of rookie *Matt Stafford*. I watched in amazement as the rookie led his team to 24 unanswered points, the last touchdown coming on a snazzy 22-yard pass to *Santonio Holmes* in the fourth quarter that had a visibly deflating effect in the visiting Patriots. At that point I started writing my article about Stafford, preparing to gush with praise at his poise and skill in leading his team to a dramatic and improbable come-

from-behind victory. But *Peyton Manning* waved his magic wand and brought the Pats' offense down the field in a hurry for a touchdown that narrowed Ringgold's lead to a mere 3 points with 7:53 remaining. The Hawks opted to continue attacking rather than attempt to run out the clock against a line that overmatched them, and that's when disaster struck. Looking very much like a Ringgold quarterback, the rookie Stafford suddenly lost his nerve and tossed a lollipop into the eager arms of *Brandon Flowers*, who ran it back untouched 42 yards for the go-ahead and winning touchdown. The collapse was complete when Charleswood marched in for an easy touchdown after *Maurice Jones-Drew* went backwards on 4th and 4 at his 28 yard line.

NEW YORK GRIPES

Kurt Warner lost a gun fight with **Matt Ryan** at the Corral. The quarterback who had attempted only 11 passes in his two previous games was let loose against the feisty but undermanned Garland secondary and responded with 4 TD passes and no interceptions. But before he could escape with the loot, Ryan "the Kid" shot the old vet's gun out of his hand, leaving him alive but with his pride severely wounded. It looks like a new sheriff's in town. The Mohave dynasty – such as it was – is fading fast.

Chad Pennington survived the whacky Winnemucca wind, throwing for 292 yards and 2 TDs to lead the Corn Kings to a 28-19 victory. He also threw 3 interceptions and made a half dozen other horrible throws. Pennington is the EFL's only knuckleball pitcher. His ball has the speed of a Graff Zeppelin and the trajectory of a mortar shell. He keeps his career alive with savvy decisions and pin point control, but he suffers more than most when faced with 20-30 mph winds. With the wind at his back in the first quarter, Pennington looked like Dan Marino. In the third quarter against the wind he looked like Rick Mirer. Performances like this make to jittery Sundays for Coach **Jim Coghlin**.

MOAHVE @ FLORIDA (LINE - DRAGONS BY 14)

The Hellfire defense is struggling mightily without Champ Bailey in the line-up. They could not stop Matt Ryan and the Mustangs last week and don't expect them to go into Dragonmount and tether Aaron Rodgers or DeAngelo Williams to the post this week. The only hope for Mohave is to get a repeat of Kurt Warner's performance against Garland and pray it holds up; but in the attempt they will play right into the hands of the turnover-hungry Florida "Firewall." This rout will not be pretty – for Adult Audiences only.

CHARLESWOOD @ GWINNETT (LINE - PATRIOTS BY 1)

The Gladiators like some of their individual match-ups on defense in the passing game and the injury to Chris Samuels makes the Pats' running game, even with Adrian Peterson, less viable. Will both teams continue along their current trend lines or will something finally break? I look at the Hawks and I see a team that *should* be where Garland is and I look at the Violators and see a team that should be getting violated more than they are doing the violating. Virden's individual stats aren't impressive but they have been getting the job done when it matters with the Brees-to-Hester/Harrison combo. Harrison is out this week, which means Hester will have no room to move. Ringgold will finally have their way with somebody.

PICK: RINGGOLD

GARLAND @ KUTZTOWN (LINE - PICK 'EM)

The Kutztown defense is missing three starters, weakening an already suspect crew. The middle of the defensive line is particularly vulnerable and has had trouble stopping the run. Garland's struggles in the running game are deceptive – they have been passing so well that they have been using it mainly as a change of pace. With Frank Gore in the backfield they can turn to that part of their game whenever they choose this week. But they may not need to – Matt Ryan is sizzling hot and there is little standing in his way. Despite some big runs by LeSean McCoy the Kutztown running game is not a threat, leaving Tony Romo standing on his own to carry the offense. The Mustangs will gallop to victory.

PICK: GARLAND

CHINO @ DURHAM (LINE - CONVICTS BY 2)

Expect a defensive struggle. Neither team will be able to move the ball consistently against the other in the Jurassic Park swamp: Durham, because they have been sporadic all year and the Convicts' defense is built to make the big play; Chino, because their running game has not been giving Jay Cutler enough support and the young QB is mistake-prone. So who will come out on top in this sentinel slugfest? Durham should have the ball longer and control the pace of play because of their offensive line. If they can avoid turning it over they will grind out a 'W' and hand Chino their second loss of the season.

PICK: DURHAM

IOWA CITY @ COWTOWN (LINE - CORN KINGS BY 8)

The Cubs finally came alive last week against the Spartans, getting solid play from the quarterback position and rushing for 166 yards. Are they back to 2008 form after a nightmarish start? They lost Aaron Curry last week to injury, meaning they will have to rely on their line exclusively to generate pressure on Pennington. The Corn Kings took care of business in Winnemucca, making some big plays but also experiencing some disturbing lapses. The Corn Kings need to take some pressure off their pivot with a better running game than they have been getting, but the Cubs have held opponent's to a league best 2.8 yards a carry. This will be a close game, with the Corn Kings squeaking out a win under the generous 8-point spread.

PICK: IOWA CITY

PICKERING @ WINNEMUCCA (LINE - OUTLAWS BY 2)

The odds-makers in Vegas do this occasionally – they throw out a line based on the fashion and not on the fundamentals. Although Pickering struggled badly last week, they are clearly a better team than Winnemucca. The problem is that they have some critical injuries to their defensive secondary and nobody knows who will line up at tight end this week with both Tony Scheffler and Fred Davis out of action. The Outlaws are similarly hurt but can still field most of their starting defense. In windy Winnemucca, strange things happen – so an Outlaw win is not of the question. But Pickering's impact players, Chris Johnson, Vincent Jackson and Eli Manning, will find a way to pull it out for Pickering.

PICK: PICKERING

MARKHAM @ LOS ANGELES (LINE - KNIGHTS BY 10)

Both Los Angeles losses this year have been close affairs they should probably have won. They have been full value for their four victories, meaning that they are the unluckiest 4-2 team in the league. The Markham offence is sliding backwards because Donovan McNabb has not posted a QB rating higher than 42.1 in the last three weeks. This week they face the highest rated defense in the league, on the road, and the prospect of actually gaining less than 100 yards of total offence has to be part of the discussion. They will get no relief from their defense as they aren't sacking anybody and their top corner, Charles Tillman, is doubtful.

PICK: LOS ANGELES
